

Samuel Neill of Belfast and Ballymacarrett in PRONI Directories: Evidence from 1805—1890

This research study conducted on the contents of the Belfast city directories held in the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland (PRONI) from the first publication in 1805 until 1890 resulted in critical new information on Samuel Neill (1809-1889). The directory listing in Image 1 shows Samuel Neill at the same address as Richardson Brothers & Co. in 1880 when he was a storekeeper, and nine years before his Will indicated he held an investment in the firm. The Richardsons were a Quaker family with deep ties to Gilford, county Down. Further information on Samuel is found in Parts 1 and 2, including his employment since 1839 and residences in Belfast and Ballymacarrett. In Part 3, evidence supports the tradition of Samuel's son, John, being a sea captain during the American Civil War. Part 4 discusses potential Neill relatives identified during the search. Advances in searchable text technology resulted in 914 records identified, supplemented by digital newspaper sources. The research method and results are discussed in Part 5, and the complete listing of Neill records is shown in Part 6. The research summary is sown next.

Timeline of Research Results

Figure 1 is a visual timeline showing the directory listings for Samuel Neill (born 1809, died 1889), for years 1805 through 1890, with occupations, addresses, and confidence levels based on the supporting evidence.¹

This visualization shows long stretches of  high confidence when backed by independent records, and highlights 1863 as the year with the greatest uncertainty. The early-to-mid career entries (1841–1866) rely more on plausible occupational and address continuity than direct proof.

Part 1

The subject of this research paper is Samuel Neill, who died 22 October 1889 at 35 Bristol street in Belfast, age 80 years.² The scope is Belfast directories from 1805 to 1890 covering the span of Samuel's lifetime. The twofold purpose is to document Samuel's presence in Belfast and identify potentially related Neill families for further research and genetic testing. The chief constraint is common to Irish research, being the lack of extant records from this period, that directory analysis helps mitigate. The subject is well-fitted to this source as he was considered having a profession or trade.

The findings of the research are presented in Table 1, producing a model of residences and occupations for the subject. The validation column indicates records supporting the subject's identification, and rationales for their applicability.

James Percy Neill, the subject's son, was born in Belfast, county Antrim, about 1839, according to the 1911 census of Ireland.³ The record is particularly informative in including his middle name, added since the 1901 census,⁴ that distinguished his identity from multiple men with the same name. An additional detail of 'Antrim co.' to his birth in Belfast appears in the 1911 record, which by then could also have been in County Down. This record places James's parents in Belfast, County Antrim, in 1839, which is the first year the subject Samuel Neill appears in the directory listings. (A complete accounting of local men with the name Samuel Neill is provided in Table 3.)

In 1839, Samuel Neill was age 30 years and his initial occupation in Belfast was grocer. While identifying his father is beyond this scope, his initial occupation is important as young men then customarily took their father's occupation. His address of Peters Hill likely indicates where he both resided and where his shop was located. Peters Hill describes a stretch of road several blocks long connecting North street westward to Shankill road, with a view of Black Mountain in the distance. The street view shows attractive housing, recently built, a short walk from St. Anne's Church of Ireland Cathedral.⁵

Samuel's initial occupation of grocer was short-lived. By 1841, Samuel was a publican and no longer a grocer. Since grocers then commonly also sold alcohol, operating a pub was not a dramatic change. He was listed in 1841 and 1842 at 68 Peters Hill. While street numbers in the city frequently changed, it is likely Samuel moved from one side of the street to the other, given his address went from odd to even.

In 1843 and 1846, Samuel drops from the directory. In October 1844, he was insolvent and filed bankruptcy in court at Carrickfergus, County Antrim. He was referred to as "Neill Samuel, of Ballymacarrett, labourer" in *Perry's Bankrupt Gazette* (right image),⁶ and more descriptively, "Samuel Neill, Ballymacarrett, formerly of Belfast, publican" in *Belfast Commercial Chronicle* (left image).⁷

While it's unknown where Samuel and his family resided in 1843, it might have been with relatives in Belfast. One Mrs. Percy rented lodgings in her home at 1 Little May street.⁸

Within a year of Samuel's insolvency, the struggling economy in Ireland worsened with the failure of the potato crop in 1845 that resulted in the loss of half of Ireland's population by 1849 through equal parts starvation and emigration. Samuel evidently remained in Ballymacarrett during this period, with his wife Sarah Jane and sons James and John, and perhaps other children.

In 1850, Samuel Neill reappeared as a grocer once again for a short time, now residing at Wheeler's place in Ballymacarrett. They had recently baptized their daughter, Jane Bell, at St. Anne's Church of Ireland Cathedral on June 29, 1849.⁹ The cathedral was nearby their prior residence in Belfast, and less than a two mile walk from Ballymacarrett. Belfast had spilled eastward over the river Lagan into Ballymacarrett, which in 1850 was its own listing and by 1852 was included in Belfast's listing, also. While Belfast was in County Antrim, Ballymacarrett was in County Down, in the civil parish of Knockbreda and in the historic barony of Castlereagh Upper. Ballymacarrett bordered the docks used for trade and ship building.

While remaining at the same residence at Wheeler's place in Ballymacarrett, Samuel by 1852 was a *carman* and no longer a grocer. As such, he would have delivered goods to individuals and local businesses for hire, perhaps as goods unloaded from the ships in port. His job was also called carter, carrier, and cart owner.

Image 8, map of Ballymacarrett, 2025

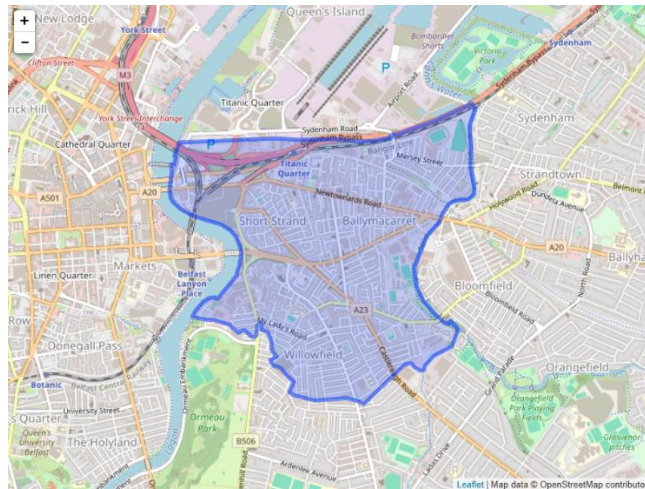

In 1863, Samuel had a new residence at Bridge end, while still a carman in Ballymacarrett. There is a second entry for this year, a storekeeper in Belfast, that has a high likelihood of also being Samuel, our subject, as he was listed as a storekeeper in later years. The location, 30 Nelson street, was around the docks area called Sailortown¹⁰ that saw a burst of economic activity as a result of the Civil War in America. This same year included the first listings for Samuel's son James, an iron moulder, and John, a sea captain. John's residence at Ship street was a short walk from Nelson street (elaborated in Part 3). This storekeeper was either a second job for Samuel during wartime due to peak demand, or an unknown man of the same name who appeared for only one year.

Samuel had the same job and residence in 1865 as in 1853. The next year, after the end of the war in America, there is a carrier business in Ballymacarrett operating as J. & S. Neill, which it's speculated refers to Samuel and his son John.

Sometime between 1866 and 1870 Samuel Neill made a second and final change in profession around age 60, and in 1870 he is listed a clerk in the directory (Image 11) and in his son James's marriage record (Image 12).¹¹ He was still in Ballymacarrett, at 33 Mount street, near the Albert Bridge road. It's surmised he was a clerk in a mill, as two years later when he son John wed, Samuel was a mill manager (Image 13).

In 1877, Samuel still resided east of the river Lagan, but in Belfast now, at 27 Sunnyside street. During the decade of the 1870's, Samuel went from clerk to mill manager to storekeeper for Richardson Brothers and Company. As shown on page 1, Samuel's residence of 37 Divis street overlaps that of the company in 1880. Most likely he progressed in these roles all while at Richardson Brothers, working as a storekeeper until at least 1884, aged well into his 70s.

Samuel Neill's last residence, beginning in 1884, was 35 Bristol street in Belfast, west of the river in Sandy Row area. He is listed in the 1887 directory without an occupation. Samuel's widow, Sarah Jane, remained in the home after his 1889 death, and the 1890 directory shows Samuel C. Neill. (It is unknown where the 'C' originated, at this late stage.)

The last will and testament of Samuel Neill was granted in court on 11 December 1889, with effects of £941 17s. 5d.¹³ This was an impressive sum for the era, especially considering his earlier financial trouble. Key personal information discussed above is evidenced in the will and circled in red in Images 16 and 17: Samuel Neill, 35 Bristol street, was the husband of Sarah Jane Percy and father of John Neill, who resided in America in 1889. His other sons were James and Thomas. His daughters were Mary Mallin, wife of James Mallin, and Jane Bell McNally, wife of George McNally.

Additional important information is circled in blue. He was a storekeeper. He owned an investment in Richardson Brothers and Company, Limited, indicating he was held in a position of trust by its owner, the Belfast industrialist and noted Quaker John Grubb

Richardson, son of James Nicholson Richardson.¹⁴ While beyond the scope of this paper, relationships with the Nicholson and Richardson families are believed essential to the origins of Samuel Neill.

Also circled in blue, the executors were John M'Clinton, Thomas Thomson and Thomas Ruddock Walker, and Samuel's personal and business relationships with them likely went back decades. M'Clinton and Thomson were business partners, as shown in Table 2.

Lastly, closing out the record of this couple, "Letters of Administration of the personal estate of Sarah Jane Neill late of Bristol-street Belfast Widow who died 13 June 1890 at same place were granted at Belfast to Thomas Neill of Sandringham Villa Sydenham County Down Linen Salesman a Child," on July 4, 1890. The effects of her estate were valued £45.¹⁵

Part 2

The model produced in Table 1 was further evaluated against all remaining instances of the name Samuel Neill to check for the possibility of misidentification.

It is first noted that Samuel was the fifth most common name among Neill men, representing approximately 5% of observations in Table 3. The top two names, James and John, were so common as to represent almost half of all names in this sample. Joseph, while also in the top 10, represented merely 2%. Together, the top 10 names represented 92% of Neill men. Three of these names – Robert, Henry, Charles – have no record of use in

the subject's family. An additional 13 names account for 8% of observations, with shares of usage representing between 0% and 1%.

The data in Table 3 indicate that first name analysis is a poor indicator of potential relationship between Neill families. The exception to this rule could be for rarely used first names such as Hamilton and Sharman that might be shared generationally or among branches. Accordingly, it is expected to encounter men named Samuel Neill in the historical record who are of no relation to the subject. Further, the use of the name Samuel Neill in one family group does not signal potential relationship to another Neill family group.

In Table 4, early instances of the name Samuel Neill that were *not included* in the model are isolated for further evaluation. The first three entries occur from 1819 to 1841, which is followed by a generational gap between 1841 and 1863 in which no other Samuel Neill men appear in the directories aside from those entries accounted for in the model in Table 1.

The first entry, 1819, was a shoemaker on Berry street that did not recur in later directories. Since our subject was age 10 in 1819, there is no possibility of mistaken identity. The second entry was a pawnbroker who first appeared in 1835 and last appeared in 1839. He had a prime location in city center on Little Donegall street. This man can be ruled out as mistaken for our subject given his 1837 marriage to Margaret Anderson.¹⁶

Image 18, marriage of Samuel Neill, pawnbroker, 1837

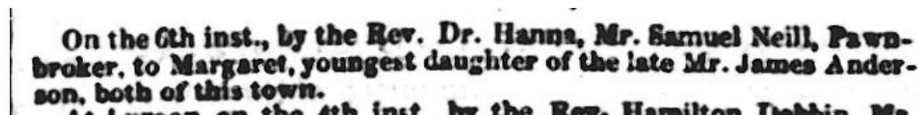

The third entry, 1841, was a commercial traveller. This individual does not recur. One possibility is this 1841 entry is the same person as the pawnbroker. The pawnbroker who appeared in 1835 was likely the son of Samuel Neill who died in Belfast in 1832. “Died on Wednesday last, Mr. Samuel Neill, of Belfast, broker, aged 61 years.”¹⁷

After the generation gap, there are two more Samuel entries who could possibly be of a similar age to our subject, while not presenting the potential for mistaken identity. In 1863, the bread server at 24 Cambridge street might possibly have been the railway servant who died in 1890. “Letters of Administration of the personal estate of Samuel Neill late of Hopeton-street Belfast Railway Servant who died 24 January 1890 at same place were granted at Belfast to William Neill of Hopeton-street Belfast Bread Server the Son.”¹⁸

In 1865, in addition to our subject, there was another Samuel from Ballymacarrett, and both were in proximity of Bridge end. The unidentified entry is a labourer on Old Ballymacarrett road from Bridge end to Ballyhackamore.

The entries pertaining to our subject, Samuel Neill, comprise the model in Table 1 and are green highlighted in Table 6. These represent almost half the entries, 16 of 33, in Table 6.

In Table 5, nine individuals are identified between 1870 and 1890 from the results in Table 6. There is no uncertainty about the subject Samuel during this period for years 1870, 1880, 1884, 1887.

The moulder in 1870 at 49 Cavour street and the farmer in 1877 at 13 Brownlow street were likely the same person. In 1870, he resided near James Neill, baker, at 55 Cavour street and then in 1877 near James Neill, baker and shopkeeper, at 11 Brownlow street. James was at the same address in 1880 as a grocer, while Samuel is no longer found.

Of the remaining eight individuals, Samuel of 4 Penrith street was a moulder and grandson of the subject. Samuel, at Hopeton street, died in 1890, and is discussed above. Samuel H., commercial traveller, was from Ballymoney and died in 1915 in England, and is discussed in Table 15 below. Five remain unaccounted. During this period, between 1864 and 1885, there were four deaths recorded of working age men named Samuel Neill. Of these four, two died in the Belfast Workhouse, another was from County Down, and one record in which these details are not stated.¹⁹

Part 3

In 1863, Samuel seems listed twice, as a carter in Ballymacarrett and nearby as a storekeeper on Nelson street by the Belfast docks. This year, two of Samuel sons, James and John, appeared in the directories for the first time.

James was the most common first name carried by Neill men in Belfast, though only one was an iron moulder. This enabled his easy identification in the directories, particularly since he maintained this profession throughout his working years. His appearance in the directory coincides with his marriage, and likewise his absence shortly thereafter in 1866 coincides with the death of his first wife. As shown in Table 8, after he reappears in 1877, he is found at only two more addresses, at Wilson street and 16 Beverley street.

John Neill, the second son of Samuel and Sarah Jane Neill, was born about 1843 and went to sea while in his teens.²⁰ He reported first being in America in 1860,²¹ although he might have had even earlier experience in British sea lanes.

Belfast directories show a sustained jump in population growth starting around 1852, and its thriving port was essential to its population and economic growth. There were ample opportunities for young man to gain experience at port and sea. In 1863, John Neill was a seacaptain and resided at 6 Ship street, in the Sailortown area of the Belfast port discussed and shown above in Image 9.

Image 20, Belfast directory, 1863

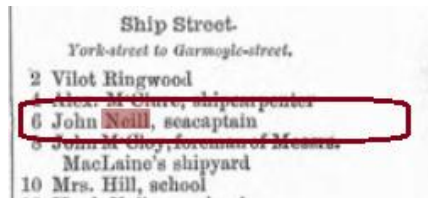

The occupational term ‘seacaptain’ was new to the directories in 1863, as shown in Table 9. The term coincided with the surge in shipping from the British Isles to the American South during its civil war that began in 1861. It’s usage dropped dramatically thereafter, then resurging in 1900.

Master-mariner was the title of the most seasoned and expert seamen, which had to be earned. In Table 10, there were eight men who were both master-mariner and seacaptain in 1863, seven master-mariners and four mariners. This compares to 47 seacaptains, comprising seven master-mariners and 41 freshly minted seacaptains in 1863. John Neill is shown as a seacaptain in 1863, in Table 10, among familiar Belfast surnames.

John Neill was, according to family tradition, a sea captain from Belfast during the Civil War, running the Federal blockades to deliver British goods to Southern ports. He was age 20 years when he was made seacaptain.²²

Image 21, letter with sea captain tradition, 1978, "no proof is available"

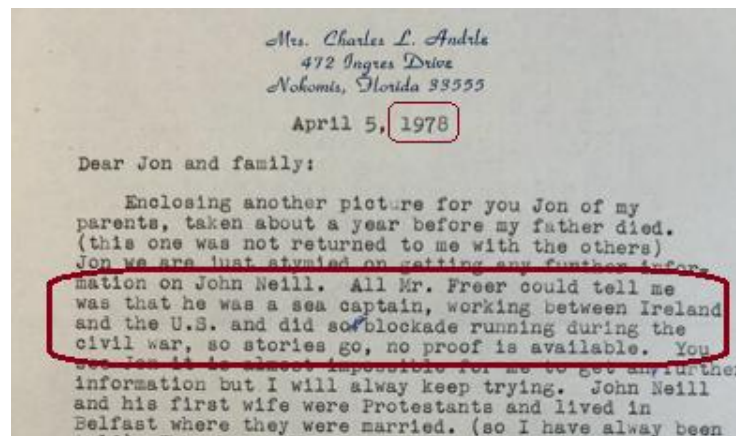

John Neill supposedly returned to Belfast after the end of the Civil War, and as discussed above was likely the 'J.' of J. & S. Neill, carrier and cart owners in Ballymacarrett in 1866 along with his father Samuel. He is found in one other directory record, under the spelling variant John Neil, in 1870, residing at Brookfield place in Belfast. It is believed this is the correct identification since two years later, in 1872, he married Martha, who was a winder in the nearby Brookfield Factory Belfast.

Part 4

The secondary purpose of this research is to seek relatives of Samuel Neill for genetic testing. Although he was the sixth generation to use the surname Neill, rather than O'Neill, to date no other Neill branches have been identified through either genealogical research or Y-DNA testing. The subject, Samuel Neill, is Y-DNA branch R-BY76660 that formed circa 1500, associated with a branch of the O'Neill family in Ulster that originated with Eoghan,

or Owen, son of Niall of the Nine Hostages. The branch comprises surname variants O'Neill, O'Neal, Neill, Neel, Neal, along with one branch with the surname Redfern.²⁵

There were signals in the directory records of possible relationships to the subject, although with no clear results. Six results are shown in Table 11, along with a description of the individual and salient details. The results with the highest possibility of relationship are listed first, with the signals in bold. These are opportunities for further research.

The Neill family in Clare townland, Tullylish parish, County Down likely descended from William Neill, born 1711, the son of John Neill and Esther Reford, also O'Neill. Thomas Neill (#1, Table 11) died age 60 in 1894 at Clare, and was a manager of a weaving factory.²⁶ He was in Belfast by 1865 as a power loom manager. Letters of administration were granted to "Thomas Neill of Clare Farmer the Son." The son was not located in the 1901 or 1911

census in Clare or Belfast, nor did any Neill remain in Clare. John Neill died 1881 at Clare, age 82 years. John is in the tithe applotment book at Clare, 1820-1840, and also in Griffiths Valuations, 1837-1864, at dwelling 109 nearby Hugh Neill at dwelling 106a.²⁷ Hugh (#2) shows up in Belfast in 1839, as did the subject Samuel, and resided nearby. Directory records give his name as Neill and O'Neill. Possibly the same Hugh from Clare who lived nearby John Neill. William (#4) shared a family occupation, grocer and spirits merchant, and in 1844 was at the port of Belfast with Lewis Reford purchasing whiskey.²⁸ William was second of four generations of wine and spirits merchants shown in Table 12.

John Neill (#3) signals a potential relationship to William Neill, who married the daughter of Thomas Purdy of Gilford. The trustee of John's estate, Mr. Benson, is possibly from the same family that were partners of John Neill in the linen industry in the mid-1700s.

John Neill (#5) was a linen draper originally from Bangor, who moved to Belfast in 1846 to work for Richardson, Sons, & Owden. In later years, John had his own business and Samuel Neill was employed by Richardson Brothers & Co. These firms, shown in Image 24, were all owned by the same Richardson family. In 1887, Samuel resided at 27 Sunnyside street, and in 1880, John resided at 30 Sunnyside street, in Ballynafeigh (Ballynafoy) neighboring Ballymacarrett. In his Will, John mentions his brothers, James and Robert (there was no Samuel mentioned), and refers to Belfast, Mountpottinger, and Lisburn. John had a son William who emigrated to Baltimore with his wife, but died soon after and left no children.²⁹

Another Neill with a Bangor-Lisburn connection was Samuel, who like our subject, was bankrupt in 1838, "Samuel Neill, formerly of Bangor, county Down, and late of Lisburn, county Antrim, grocer and writing clerk."³⁰ He is possibly the same person as the manager of gas company in Lisburn, appearing in the directories between 1842 and 1858, and who died in 1860 age 55 years and was interred at Blaris, County Down.³¹

Image 24, Richardson Brothers & company, 1863

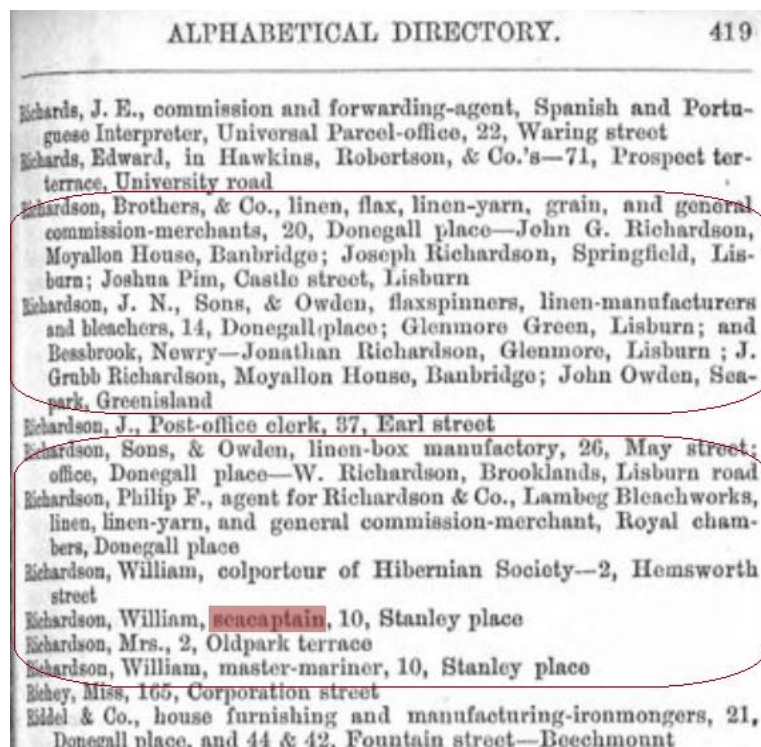

Robert Neill (#6) of Bangor has the faintest of signals in that he was a master-mariner, captain and ship owner who resided in 1850 at 6 Ship street, which was the same address later occupied by John Neill, seacaptain, in 1863. Possibly the connection was merely as a residence for sea captains. Yet, it is unclear though what social connection John was made seacaptain at age 20 years. Robert had a son John who was a master-mariner in the 1850s, so there is little chance of mistaken identity.

Equally possible was a social or family connection through the Nicholson family, who was prominent in Bangor: Robert's daughter married a Nicholson, Samuel Neill's grandmother is believed Deborah Nicholson from Bangor and Lisburn, the Richardsons of Richardson companies were intermarried with the Nicholsons. The Robert Neill family was prominent in Belfast and Bangor shipping and commerce throughout the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, and is well documented.³²

In addition to patterns identified in Table 11, single characteristics were considered for indications of potential relationships. The results for shared occupations, location, presence in the 1850 directory, and name 'Samuel' are shown in Table 13.

In Table 14, the results from Ballymacarrett show a Neill family there in 1843 involved in the pottery and tile trade. The name Con indicates the family was likely native Irish. Samuel in 1865 is already discussed, and no other trends were identified. Ballymacarrett is sometimes called out as a distinct place, and other times just an area of Belfast.

In Table 15, the Neill records were reviewed by location, which was important for the 20% not from Belfast. While 80% of the records are shown from Belfast, this is misleading in that provincial coverage was not always included, and when it was, it was incomplete. In general, women, the poor, and native Irish were not intended as directory content. In 1863, for example, the directory included "tenements rated at and above 6 pounds" (p. 37), with one effect being the inclusion of Thomas Neill, grocer, followed by a notation of "sixty four small houses" not included (p. 248).

While exclusion from the directory contents was one problem, another was concentration of entries from a few families that owned businesses. In 1877, for example, 11 individuals (11%) and their companies generated 48 of the 150 Neill records (32%). The results in Table 15 are accordingly best considered locales with the presence of Neill families, rather than an attempt of comprehensive coverage and accounting.

This research would be incomplete without mentioning the Robert Neill family, Belfast jewelers.³³ They were found in every year between 1805 and 1890, and their presence often dominated content, spanning multiple generations. The family is also found in Table 15 in Holywood and Londonderry.

Aside from Ballymacarrett and Bangor already discussed, Ballymoney is important to this research. Although with only 1% of entries and from only two individuals, prior research indicates the long-term presence of a Neill family from Ballymoney who were Presbyterians and involved in the linen industry, that regularly come up in research, sometimes in the context of other locations. For example, mentioned above, “Samuel H. Neill died November 29 [1915], at a nursing home in the south of England, Samuel H. Neill, Lodgehill, The Park, Dunmurry,”³⁴ whose death notice was published in the *Ballymoney Free Press And Northern Counties Advertiser*.

Presbyterians and Quakers were among Dissenters, and in Ballymoney, in 1766, there were three Dissenter families named Neill–Adam, James, Thomas.³⁵ In 1817, a local Presbyterian minister performed a census of Ballymoney parish, with details of all the Neill families.³⁶ This information was included in a Glens of Antrim Historical Society Forum online research response, and is provided in its entirety in accord with its importance. The conclusion is that Samuel Neill, our subject, born 1809, was not from the Ballymoney family of Neill.

Part 5

Directory data results are shown in Table 16, with an accounting of each directory, by year, and the number of results and persons identified. Going to the source of Public Record Office of Northern Ireland (PRONI), <https://streetdirectories.proni.gov.uk/>, and entering the keyword *Neill* with no other parameter will yield 1,968 results. A result is a page containing the keywords, so these numbers do not equate with the number of persons identified. Additionally, in instances this surname was sometimes used as a first name.

The PRONI data was used to create the inventory of Neill records from the years 1819 to 1890. This includes all the years in which had a low or growing population. The large population present in 1892 and thereafter distracted from the research purpose, although all data in these years was manually reviewed. PRONI data was supplemented by outside sources to include years back to 1805, thereby covering the life span of the subject who was born in 1809 and died in 1889.

Overall, PRONI's automated search functionality worked as designed and is an excellent tool for improving efficiency and accuracy of research. Prior, manual reviews missed entries, especially those not included in the alphabetical listing at the front of the directory and found only in the street level details. I published an error in *Chronicle of the Neill Family, Volume One* (2019), on page 1 no less, mistaking the subject Samuel Neill with the resident at 36 Hudson. Turns out, most the *other* entries would have properly identified him!

Accordingly, among conclusions of this study, it can be stated with confidence that the subject, Samuel Neill, was not born in Belfast.

In Table 17, the content of two different PRONI directories are compared from the year 1852. While there were 12 entries in common between the two directories, Henderson had one unique entry while the primary directory had seven unique entries from Belfast and 18 unique entries from provincial listings.

While working with the PRONI data presents the opportunity to ensure a full data set, creating a manual inventory opens the door to error. I performed an additional quality check of my results and found a 5% error rate, or 95% correct. The errors were of page number transcription (e.g., 178 instead of 278) or omission of a page number when an individual was included on multiple pages. During sampling, I did not find individuals missing, nor would the errors I did find have prevented other researchers from getting to same result.

Part 6

Part 6 is the full inventory of 914 records produced. The pages that follow are abstracted records representing all directory entries for the name Neill between 1805 and 1890. Pages numbers are provided for ease of locating online research results.
